The spring sailing season is here! Please come out and enjoy your club. One of the big benefits of joining CYC is use of the club for your private function. All that is required is to contact a board member, fill out the club usage form and it's yours on a non-exclusive basis for the day or evening. The only time usage is restricted is during a club held event.

As the boating season is heating up, please remember to update flares, medical kits, fire extinguishers, registration with Coast Guard and/or Louisiana Wildlife and Fisheries depending on whether your boat is documented or not. Check all hoses, fittings, filters, batteries and fluids. Thru hull fittings should be checked for leaks and corrosion, and should be able to be closed easily. Also back up plugs should be in place in the event a thru hull fitting breaks. Stuffing boxes should be checked regularly, and adjusted when necessary. Water is required to lubricate conventional packing, so a properly adjusted

stuffing box can be watertight when the shaft is stopped, but it must drip when the shaft is turning. Two or three drops per minute are adequate. It is not uncommon to see stuffing boxes leak at a much higher rate. This doesn't harm the shaft or the stuffing box, but the spinning shaft will sling this excess flow all over the engine compartment, leading to rampant corrosion of the shaft coupling, the transmission housing and everything else getting sprayed. Even more disastrous, it puts an unattended boat at risk of sinking if the bilge pump fails, the float switch jams or the battery dies. If your stuffing box leaks more than 8 or 10 drops a minute, it needs servicing. Tightening the stuffing box nut a half turn is usually all that is required to reduce the leak.

Our club has numerous spots for dry storage of not only small sailboats but also for sport fishing boats. If you intend to fish Cypremort this season, consider

leaving your boat at the club. The cost for a spot is \$25 per month. The boat will be out of your way and closer to the launch ramp without the stress of towing your boat back and forth. Less wear on the trailer and the vehicle. A

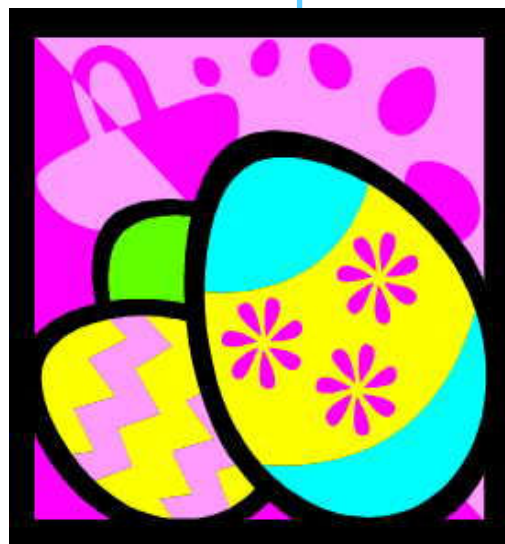
Juniors can attend the camp more than once, which is recommended to continue to learn and build skills/
